

Middlesex Free Entry Competitions

These may not be entered unless an entry is made to the Confined Aggregate competition.

Classification

All competitors must submit their certified 25 yard average, based on the best 10 of the last 12 cards shot on N.S.R.A. 1989 targets. Properly witnessed match or league scores must be used where available.

Competition entry will be split into 4 classes, with approximately the same number of competitors in each class. Competitors who do not submit an average will be placed in Class A.

Competitors will only be entered in one class, but may elect to shoot in a higher class if they wish.

Bench Rest Competition

There will be a limited number of firing points at 50 metres equipped for bench rest shooting. The competition will be a 40 shot course of fire, consisting of 2 x 20 minute details on N.S.R.A. 1989 series 50M targets. Shooting will follow the same details as for the prone rifle competition.

There will be separate Bench Rest competitions for Any Sights and for Iron Sights. Please see the separate rule sheet for this competition.

Prizes for the Bench Rest competitions will be awarded dependant upon entry. Unless there are sufficient entries, there will be one class.

Notes

The Middlesex Small-Bore Rifle Association and Hendon Rifle Club can take no responsibility for any loss or damage to property left or stored at the range.

Should any competitor be unable to shoot, the entry fee will be returned, less £2 for administration, upon written application at least 1 week prior to the meeting, at the discretion of the committee.

Individual Trophies and Medals detailed under 'Confined Events' may only be won by Middlesex residents who are members of MSBRA affiliated clubs or who are Individual Associate Members of the Association – unless specified below.

The County Championship for the Cheylesmore Challenge Cup

1st The Cup and County Scrolled Plaque
2nd County Plaque
3rd County Gilt Medal

Class A The Charles W Gregory Trophy
Class B The Hamilton's Cup
Class C The ENV Cup
Class D The Chairman's Cup

Class winners will also receive a County Scrolled Plaque. Class runners up will be awarded a County Gilt Medal.

The Ladies Championship for the Ladies Championship Cup

1st The Cup and County Scrolled Plaque
2nd County Plaque

The Heldman Cup - 100 yard Team Competition

1st The Trophy and 4 County Gilt Medals will be awarded to the affiliated Club Team with the highest score in the 100 yard team competition. Clubs can enter more than one team.

The Club Fours Cup - 50 metre Team Competition

1st The Trophy and 4 County Gilt Medals will be awarded to the affiliated Club Team with the highest score in the 50 metre team competition. Clubs can enter more than one team.

The Long Range Shield

1st Awarded to the club with the highest combined aggregate in the Club Fours and Heldman competitions.

The Junior Championship for the Donald Challenge Cup

Competitors must be under 21 years of age on the first day of the meeting.

1st The Cup and County Scrolled Plaque

The Middlesex Club Team of 4 Handicap for the Kodak Cup (50 metre cards)

Each Team Member must have shot at least 5 times in the Middlesex Prone Rifle Winter League 2010/11 for the club declared on the entry form. That league will be used to calculate the Team Members average for the Team Handicap (Macrae). Clubs can enter more than one team.

1st The Cup and 4 County Gilt Medals

The Middlesex Club Champions Competition for the James Cullen Trophy

Open to current Club Rifle Champions (one entry per club only). Must be for their club indicated on the entry form.

1st The Trophy and County Scrolled Plaque

The Middlesex Club Secretaries Competition for the Daily Telegraph Cup

Open to the current Secretaries of Clubs affiliated to the Association. This competition will be shot using the Macrae handicap system, based on the current 25 yard declared average (one entry per club only).

1st The Cup and County Scrolled Plaque

The Newcomers Competition for the Severn Cup

Open to competitors who have not previously shot in a National or County Meeting prior to the day of shooting.

1st The Cup, County Scrolled Plaque and N.S.R.A. Bisley Voucher (Reduced entry fee to the national meeting, subject to availability)

The Veterans Competition for the Frigidare Challenge Cup

Open to competitors aged 60 or over on the day of the meeting.

1st The Cup and County Scrolled Plaque

The Glukstein Cup for non-County 'A' team shooters

Open to Middlesex residents not County 'A' team registered during 2010/11. Can only be won once.

Procedures

BREACH FLAGS MUST BE USED AT ALL TIMES EXCEPT BETWEEN THE 'STAND BY' AND 'UNLOAD' COMMANDS. THESE WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR SALE AT THE MEETING.

Targets will be issued on the firing point. They will be marked as required. No other markings are necessary. Competitors will change their own targets. Competitors should provide their own clips. At least 18 clips are recommended. All shooting will be on N.S.R.A. 1989 series targets.

On the range, when given the instruction by the Chief Range Officer to change targets, proceed down the range and put up your cards. The cards shall be placed with the sighter at the top where appropriate. Backing cards shall be fixed to the front of the rear target frame.

At the commencement of each squad, the Chief Range Officer will remind you of the range instructions. You will be advised to 'settle down', and then 'stand by'. Shooting will commence on the command 'commence firing'. You may not pick up your rifle until the command 'commence firing' has been given.

TWENTY MINUTES will be allowed for sighting and the shooting of all 20 scoring shots. You may fire any number of sighting shots at any time. A 50 Metre detail shall consist of 4 scoring diagrams, and five shots must be fired at each. A 100 Yard detail shall consist of 2 scoring diagrams, and ten shots must be fired at each.

Competitors are requested not to angle their shooting position to exceed more than one metre width on the firing point, as a courtesy to other competitors.

All competitors must remain on the firing point until the detail has finished, thus not disturbing the other competitors. A whistle will indicate the end of the shooting period. The Chief Range Officer will then give the instruction 'unload, breeches open, change targets'.

THERE WILL BE NO SMOKING ON THE FIRING POINT.

NINE MINUTES allowed for changing targets. The Chief Range Officer will be pleased to advise you if you are unsure of the procedures.

Recorded Scores

It is the responsibility of competitors to see that their scores are recorded correctly on the exhibited lists. The Association cannot enter into any correspondence regarding scores after the close of the meeting. Scores may be challenged for a fee of £2 per 20 shot card, returnable if upheld. Ties will be resolved on count-back.

Time Table

Morning Squads start at 9.30 a.m. Afternoon Squads start at 1.30 p.m. Squads will consist of 1 hour shooting (two details), 1 hour rest and 1 hour shooting (two details). There will be no lunch break.

The Committee reserves the right to vary times of shooting, which will be advised with your squadding notice.

Entries will be dealt with in strict rotation of receipt.

Ammunition and Refreshments will be on sale as available

Conduct of Shooting

Shooting will be in accordance with the published N.S.R.A. Rules, except where otherwise stated. Any dispute will be decided by three or more members of the Middlesex Small-Bore Rifle Association Committee, or their elected deputies.
